ALL JAPAN Zone

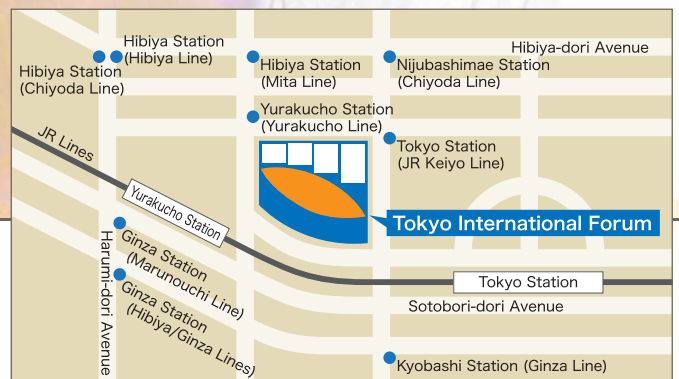
